

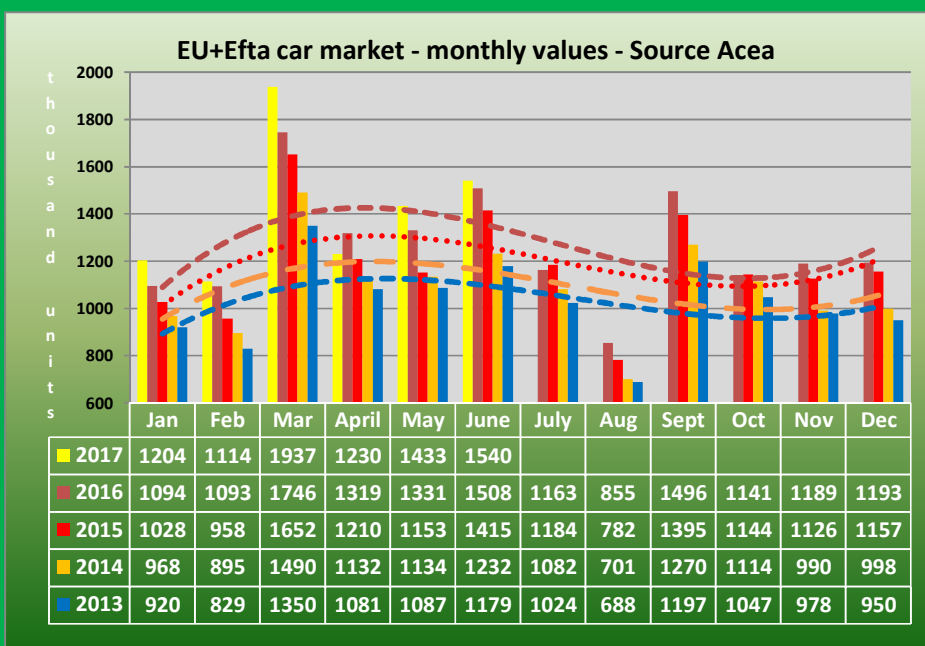

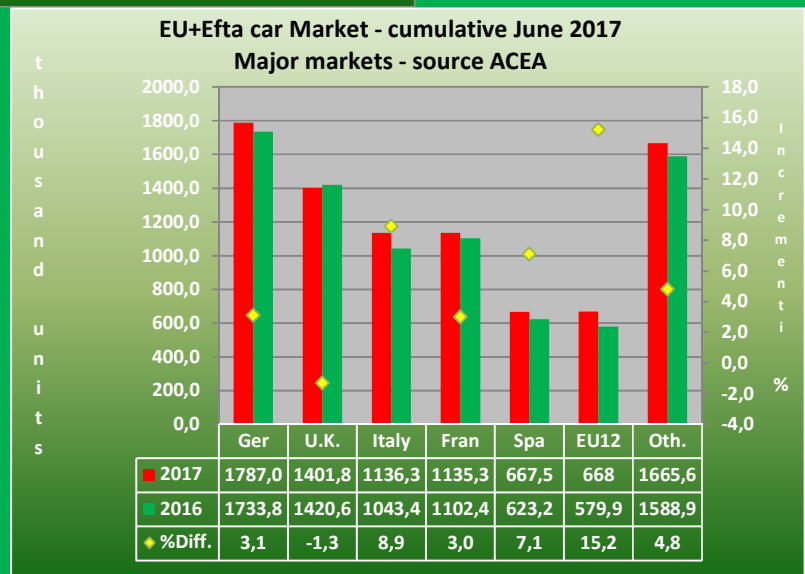
European (EU+EFTA) car market. June 2017 registrations

In June 2017, passenger car registrations increased only modestly (+2.1%) in the EU+Efta. In volume terms, however, as noted by Acea, last month's figures come very close to those from June 2007, just before the automotive industry was hit by the economic crisis – thus marking the market's best performance in a decade of the year.



In the analysis of registrations by geographical area the best country was Italy with a +12.9%, followed by the EU12 with a +12% [mainly due to Romania (+47%), Estonia (+33,7%), Slovenia (+16.4%), Slovakia (+14.5%) and Hungary (+11.6%)] and Spain (+6.5%). The EFTA area rose by 3.1% and France by 1.6%, while Britain lost 4.8% and Germany 3.5%. In the first half of the year, EU12 rose by 15.2%

[mainly due to Romania (+27%), Poland (+17.2%) and Hungary (+19.2%)], followed by Italy with +8.9%, Spain (+7.1%), Germany (+3.1%) and France with +3.0%. Great Britain loses 1.3%. The Efta area gains 1.1%. Great Britain remains in second place and Italy ranked third in the ranking of the major European countries.
