

Italian car market - May 2022

The strongly negative trend of sales on the car market eased in May: 121,299 units registered: -15.1%. In the first five months of the year 556,974 units registered, -24.1% on the previous year . Registrations trend. ('000 units) Source Min. Trasporti / Anfia / Unrae



According to Anfia, "the negative variation recorded the by car market is reduced. although we are still facing a double-digit (-15.1%),decline also thanks to an extra working day (22 days in May 2022 against 21 in May 2021) - says Paolo Scudieri, President ANFIA. The recent entry into force, in the second half of the month, of the incentives for the purchase of zeroand low-emission cars (electric, plug-in hybrid low-impact and endothermic) has certainly plaved an important role. In this regard, we point out that

the greatest number of requests was concentrated in the 61-135 g / km of CO2 range, for which the available resources are already running out, with a residual less than 25% of the total allocated for this. category

For its part, the Unrae. states: "The support system still contains some weaknesses that UNRAE has repeatedly indicated, starting with the request - made by the entire sector - to extend the deadline for taking advantage of the incentive from 180 to 300 days from the signing of the contract", Underlines the President of UNRAE Michele Crisci. "Furthermore, the problem of exclusion from the benefit of legal persons (companies and rental companies) remains unresolved, an omission that effectively reduces the contribution of the automotive industry to the country's decarbonisation process". The President of UNRAE therefore reiterates the request to raise the percentage of VAT deductibility for company cars in mixed use on zero or low emission engines



Unemployment is stationary at 8.4% in April compared to 8.4% in March; it was 10.2% in April 2021. Youth unemployment fell to 23.8% from 25.1% in March; it was 32.5% last year.

As for the automotive sector as a whole, according to preliminary data from Anfia, in March the domestic production of cars decreased by 28.4% compared to March last year. The share of gas

vehicles rose to 8.8% compared to 8.8% in March and 8.6% last year. Along with electric and hybrid vehicles, the share of alternative traction vehicles to oil was 52.1% in May compared to 51.9% in April, thanks exclusively to electric vehicles. In May, the share of diesel was



19.5%. Petrol vehicles stood at 28.4%.
