

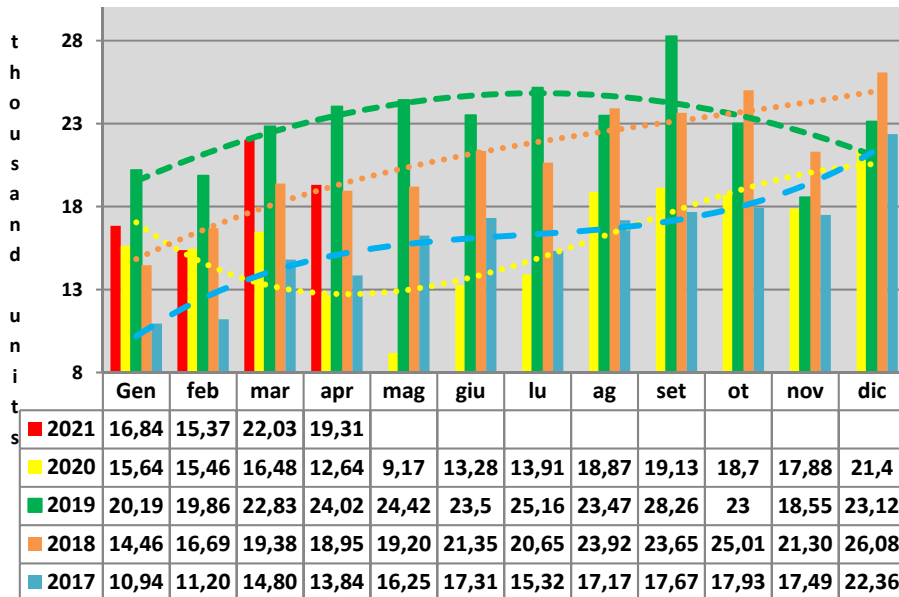


## U.S. heavy Trucks market (class 8) – April 2021 sales

### Further substantial increase vs 2020 in the heavy trucks market (class 8) in April

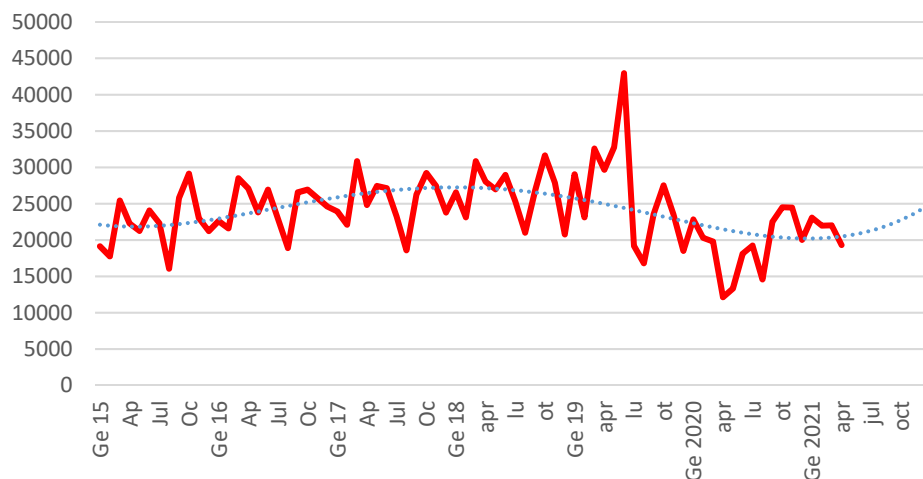


According to preliminary data from Ward's Automotive, as reported by Transport Topics, with 19.312 units, sales of class 8 vehicles in April decreased by 12,3% compared to March, but increased by 52,8% compared to last year. In the cumulative of the 1st four months, sales grew by 22,1% compared to last year with 73.534 units sold compared to 60.219 of last year.

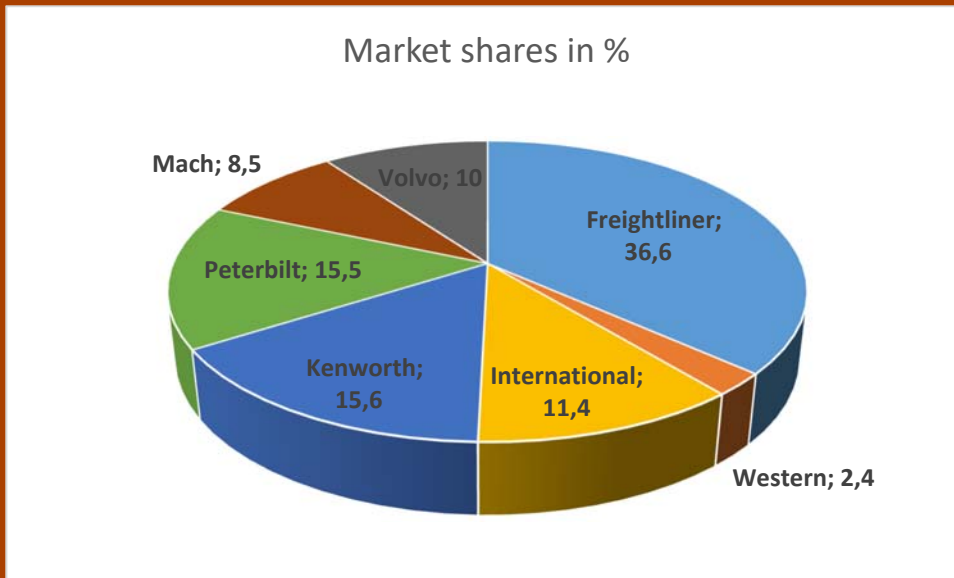
From a commercial vehicle demand point of view, Class 8 truck orders totaled 34,600 units in April, reflecting continuing strong demand and putting more pressure on OEMs to keep pace in the face of supply chain challenges.

FTR noted orders strength was "above normal," marking the

U.S. Trucks sales - class 8 - monthly data

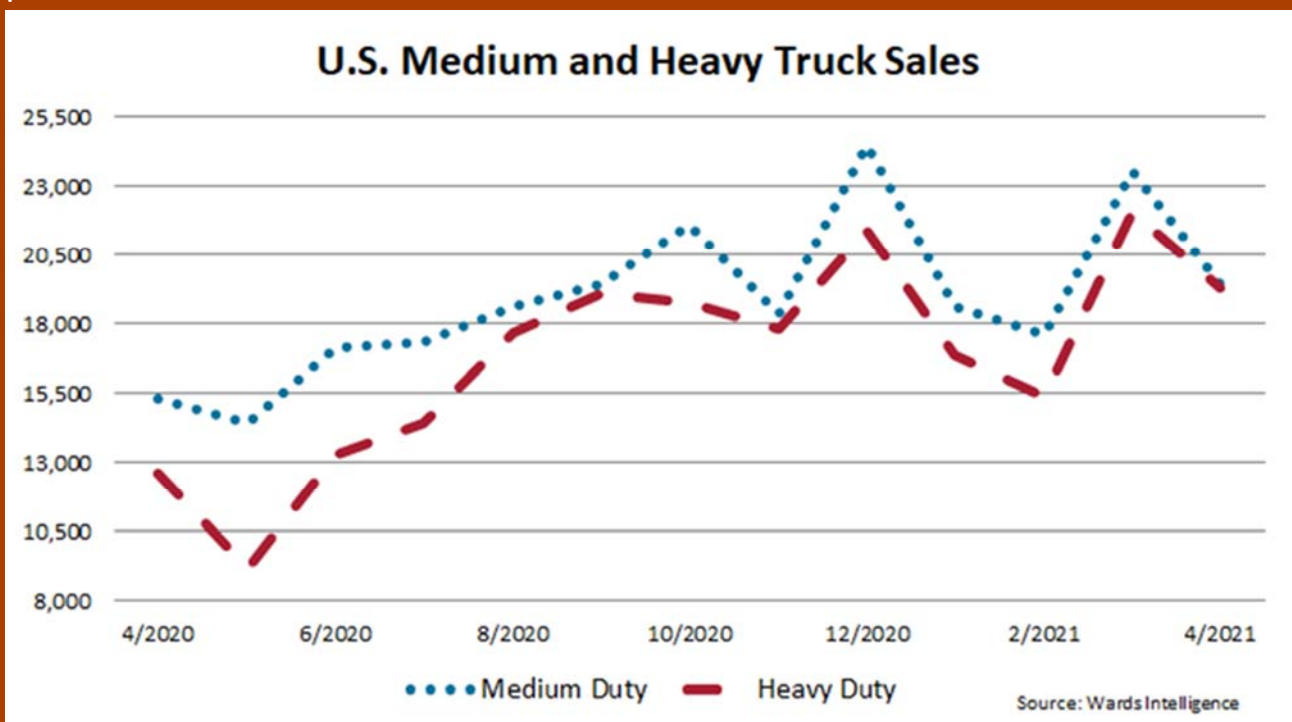


strongest April since 2018. Orders fell 15% from March but a whopping 30,500 units above April 2020 when the pandemic curtailed demand.



Alongside the breakdown of the market in April 2021.

The total of heavy trucks (classes 4 to 8) reached 38,743 units in April, 38.6% more than in April 2020 when they totaled 27,954 units.



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
